Operation Sovereign Borders (OSB) is a military-led, border security operation, seated within the Department of Home Affairs, supported and assisted by a wide range of federal government agencies.

The OSB Joint Agency Task Force has been established to ensure a whole of government effort to combat people smuggling and protect Australia's borders.
